Merkel H. Jacobs, whose given name was his mother's maiden name, was born on December 6, 1885 in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. He earned his A.B. in 1905 and his Ph.D. in 1908 from the University of Pennsylvania. He returned to the University of Pennsylvania in 1910 after completing post-doctoral studies, and remained there until his retirement in 1955. His primary studies areas were protozoology, cell permeability, and erythrocytes. Volume 47 (1956) of the Journal of Cellular and Comparative Physiology was dedicated to Dr. Jacobs in recognition of his scientific contributions and work as an associate editor of the journal beginning in 1932.

Dr. Jacobs served as Associate Director from 1925-26 and as director from 1926-1938. He also directed the Physiology course from 1921-1929. He is credited with staggering the summer courses to alleviate overcrowding and shepherding the MBL through the Great Depression.
